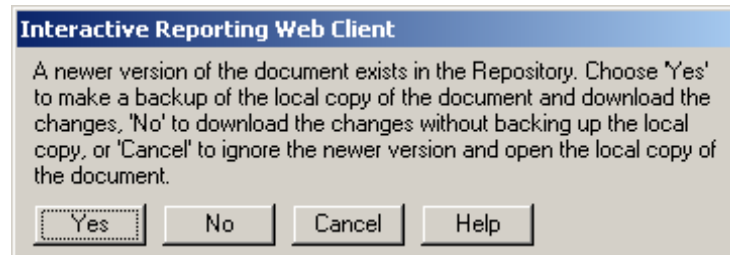


## Understanding the *Interactive Reporting Web Client* Hyperion dialog box

You will receive the following dialog box when you are opening one of your locally saved Brio or Hyperion documents.



### Why?

Hyperion is finding a newer version of this document in the (Hyperion) Repository (server).

### How did that happen?

Your locally save document was created using one of the documents on the Repository. The Hyperion software is smart enough to look for this.

### How does it know that?

Behind the scenes a numeric coding is assigned to all new (Brio or Hyperion) documents that are created. If you use one of these documents, modify it and save it to your computer (locally), the numeric coding stays with it.

### If you Choose:

#### Yes

- A backup of your local copy (document) is made and saved to your computer.
- The downloaded document will have the newer version changes.

#### No

- No backup of your local copy (document) is made.
- Your local copy (document) will be over written.
- The downloaded document will have the newer version changes.

#### Cancel

- Opens your local copy (document) ignoring the newer version.
- The downloaded document will **NOT** have the newer version changes.

**Important to Remember - When converting a locally saved document from Brio V6 to Hyperion V9, you will always choose **Cancel**.**
